

**CARES Act Quarterly Report October -December 2020: Report Date: January 7, 2021
Revised 2/10/23**

Yeshiva Gedola Tiferes Yerachmiel has signed and returned the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Yeshiva Gedola Tiferes Yerachmiel will receive or has received a total of \$89,711 from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

Yeshiva Gedola Tiferes Yerachmiel has disbursed \$88,450 to 114 students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of December 31, 2020.

The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act was 110, as of September 30, 2020.

The method used by Yeshiva Gedola Tiferes Yerachmiel to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive is based on the expenses for food, course material, equipment needed to participate in the educational program due to the disruption of campus operations, travel home expenses and health care related expenses which has been calculated at \$850 for a dependent student for students enrolled for the Summer 2020 semester. Students who began their enrollment for the Fall 2020 semester received a grant of \$200. All students enrolled are dependents.

Students received the following instructions with their grants: "As per the CARES Act, these grants are to be used for expenses that are related to the disruption of campus operations due to COVID-19, including things like course materials and technology as well as food, housing, health care, and childcare."
